Bennett Bill

All GCMCA transporting agencies wishing to participate with the "Bennett Bill" must meet the requirements of the legislation and the department.

These are the requirements that will be followed prior to licensure by the department:

- 1. Submit copy of the complete Conditional Upgrade License Application to the GCMCA offices, including all required attachments for GCMCA review.
- 2. Applications will be reviewed by the GCMCA Advisory Committee and Board and a letter of recommendation will be issued by the GCMCA if all requirements are properly met.
- 3. Submit required application and documentation to the department.

After receiving the license from the department, the following requirements must be followed:

- 1. Contact GCMCA staff to set up the following:
 - A. Obtain medication boxes used (if appropriate for licensure level
 - D. Present proof of equipment which meets the minimum standards of the department at the level which you are conditionally licensed to function.
- 2. All GCMCA protocols and policies must be followed at all times.
- 3. Agencies providing ALS service under the Bennett Bill will not be allowed to be routinely dispatched for intercepts since they will not have coverage at all times.
- 4. Monthly quality improvement requirements must be strictly adhered to.
- 5. A written report on the progress made by the ambulance operation on the plan of action to permanently upgrade the level of licensure, including, but not limited to information on training, equipment and personnel, will be submitted to the GCMCA every six months.
- 6. All agencies must develop an internal quality assurance process that includes appropriate levels of experience with endotracheal intubation, intravenous starts and knowledge of GCMCA protocols.
