### Genesee County MCA COMMUNITY INTEGRATED PARAMEDICINE Program Protocol

#### CIP MEDICATION ADMINISTRATION AND EXCHANGE

Initial Date: April 1, 2021

Revised Date: Section 11-09

**Purpose:** To identify the medications to be included in the CIP Medication Box and the ability to access medications not included in the CIP Box. No medication will be included on the list for which there is not an MCA adopted MDHHS approved procedure or treatment protocol in which the medication is used.

In the event an MCA has a standardized CIP medication bag and discrepancy exists between CIP program within the MCA for lines of service and protocols for which they are credentialed to utilize, it will be up to the MCA to develop a Quality Assurance system to ensure programs are only utilizing medications and the corresponding protocols for which they are credentialed.

- I. Medication Administration
  - a. Orders for medication administration must be provided in writing or with online medical direction see CIP Medical Direction protocol.
  - b. After medication administration CIP providers must remain on scene to monitor patient for 30 minutes unless otherwise specified by protocol or physician's order.
  - c. CIPs must be credentialed by the MCA on all medications administered.
- II. Medication availability and replacement
  - a. Medications available in the MCA's standardized ALS drug box do not necessarily need to be included in the CIP medication box.
  - b. The cooperating hospital's pharmacy shall accept responsibility for permanent inventory and reconciliation of CIP medication boxes.
  - c. CIP medication box exchange will be performed in accordance with the MCA medication box exchange protocols for all other EMS medication boxes within the MCA.
- II. Medications permitted for CIP patient care
  - a. All medications listed below are approved by the MCA for use by approved CIP personnel.
  - b. CIP medication box exchange process will be approved by the MCA and in accordance with established MCA protocol addressing medication box exchange within the EMS system when applicable.

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CIP indicates medications in the CIP med box; ALS indicates medications also in the ALS box.
